

## **How to Deadhead Hydrangeas the Right Way**

- 1. Wait for blooms to fade Only begin deadheading once the flowers turn brown or papery.
- 2. **Identify healthy buds** Follow the stem down and find the first strong pair of green buds.
- 3. **Make a clean cut** Cut about 0.5–1 cm above the bud pair using sterilised secateurs.
- 4. Skip autumn cuts On old wood varieties, leave the faded heads over winter to protect against frost.
- 5. **Clean your tools** Always disinfect secateurs before and after use to prevent disease spread.
- 6. **Know your variety** New wood types like *paniculata* can be deadheaded freely. Old wood types like *macrophylla* need gentler timing!
- For mopheads and oakleaf hydrangeas, deadhead in early spring not autumn to protect next year's blooms!

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
