

## How to Protect Hydrangeas from Slugs and Roder (Step-by-Step Guide)

- 1. **Identify the threat:** Look for ragged holes in leaves, slime trails (slugs), or gnav and roots (rodents).
- 2. **V Install barriers:** Use copper tape for slugs and fine wire mesh around hydrangea deter rodents.
- 3. **K** Apply natural repellents: Spray peppermint oil or vinegar solution for rodents; diatomaceous earth for slugs.
- 4. **Maintain cleanliness:** Keep the area weed-free, reduce mulch thickness, and rem fallen debris or pet food.
- 5. **\* Attract natural predators:** Provide habitat for hedgehogs, owls, or cats to keep activity in check.
- 6. **Water smartly:** Water plants early in the morning to create dry evening condition discouraging slugs.
- Choose deterrent plants: Companion planting with garlic, rosemary, or thyme r deter pests.
- 8. **Monitor and document:** Keep a journal of what works best in your specific gare environment.
